

NOAH'S LANDING DAYCAMP INFORMATION

Thanks for joining us for Noah's Landing Day Camp. Our staff are eagerly awaiting your arrival! Below you will find useful pre-arrival information.

What should your child bring to camp?

- Water bottle (please label with your campers name)
- Sunscreen (please clearly label with your campers name)
- Long pants and sturdy, close-toed shoes for pony-rides
- Rain clothes
- Swimsuit, towel, and flip-flops
- Warm jacket
- Spending money for deposit in camp store (Bring Monday)
- Bible

Daily Sign-in/out Procedures -

- Check-in begins at 8am each day.
- Pick-up is at 4pm.

Parents/guardians will be asked to sign each child in and out every day. Please fill out the Camper Check-out authorization form and return with your health form and waiver.

<u>Activities</u> – Each camper will have the opportunity to participate in great camp activities such as:

Archery Swimming Rodeo Pony Ride* Music Nature Walks

Boating Crafts Game Room Animals Games

Campers receive one pony ride per week at no additional charge. Pony rides are weather dependant, so campers are advised to bring long pants and closed-toed shoes daily.

<u>Day Camp Rodeo:</u> Come join us Friday morning at 8:15am to cheer your child on as he/she competes for fun in our unique relays. Your child will participate in one or all of the races including roping, barrel racing, goat tail tying and more. The rodeo is open to all campers and parents and is separate from the horsemanship option.

<u>Swimming</u> – Camper swim checks take place during the first swimming session on Monday morning. The test consists of a short swim and a brief session of treading water in our swim area under the supervision of our waterfront staff. Note: deep-water activities (slide, diving board, and Aqua Jump) require passing the swim check.

<u>Food –</u> Lunch and an afternoon snack are provided daily. (Breakfast is NOT provided for early arrival add-on). Wednesday overnight option includes Wednesday dinner and Thursday breakfast.

Trading Post: We use a "bank" system so campers do not have to carry money.

Items for sale: Snacks & Soda: \$.25-1.25 Souvenirs: \$1-20 Apparel: \$15-50

After camp, any bank balance of \$10 or less will be donated to the CRISTA Camps scholarship fund. Any amount over \$10 can be picked up in the store when you check out. Refunds will be held for two weeks, after which time they will be donated.

<u>Lost and Found</u> – Please label all belongings with camper's name and phone number. If the camper leaves something behind, call with a detailed description of the item and the week of camp attended. We will attempt to locate the item and mail it to you. You will be asked to provide the postage required to return the item. *All unclaimed items will be donated at the end of the summer.*

Additional Options and Accommodations

Pre-registration is required for all of these options.

<u>Early Arrival and Late Departure</u> – Special arrangements can be made for campers to arrive at Miracle Ranch beginning at 7 am and/or to be picked up no later than 5:30pm. The cost is **\$20** for Early Arrival and **\$25** for Late Departure per week.

<u>Transportation</u> – Each morning at 7:15 the Miracle Ranch van leaves the Tacoma Community College Transit Station (19th and Mildred), and stops at the Park and Ride lot in Gig Harbor (Kimball Dr.) at approximately 7:40-7:45 on the way to camp. We return to Gig Harbor at about 4:10-4:15 and then Tacoma Community College Station by 4:45 pm each afternoon (approximate times - traffic dependent). If a camper's legal guardian/designated person is not at the lot, the camper's

guardian will be called and the camper will be brought back to camp. Arrangements will be made for the guardian to pick the camper up at camp. Communication with the camp office regarding changes to your camper's travel needs is greatly appreciated well in advance. \$35 per week.

<u>Horses:</u> We offer daily horsemanship instruction for kids entering grades 3-6. This class requires long pants and boots, or sturdy shoes with a heel. Be ready to ride when you arrive at 8am (long pants, etc.). **\$95 per week**.

<u>Wednesday Overnight (optional)</u>: Campers in grades 3-6 are invited to stay overnight on Wednesday (includes dinner and breakfast). Bring a sleeping bag, pillow and change of clothing on Wednesday morning. Pick-up is on Thursday at 4pm, as usual. **\$30 per week**.

Notes from the Business Office

CAMP FEES:

Your receipt summarizes what your camp and activity fees total for the week. You may also prepay Trading Post spending money. NOTE: No refund will be given for cancellations within 30 days of the first day of camp. Cancellations are subject to a fee of \$25. Switching Camps incurs a \$15 service fee. A \$40 fee will be assessed for any returned check.

HEALTH FORM and WAIVER

Campers will not be able to attend camp without a completed health form and waiver.

REQUIRED FORMS: HEALTH FORM, WAIVER, PHYSICIAN'S AUTHORIZATION for administration of medicine.

Please complete and submit the Health and Consent Form, Waiver and Physician's Authorization for administration of medication no later than two weeks before the camp session begins. A Physician's Authorization for Administration of Medication form must be fully completed and delivered to Camps prior to Camps dispensing any of the camper's prescription medicines, over the counter meds including Ibuprofen and Tylenol, and the camper's vitamins. Even if your camper has no prescription medications, you will likely want them to have access to Camp Ibuprofen and Tylenol, and the Physicians signature is required for this. Campers will not be able to attend camp without a completed health form and waiver. These Forms are available online at www.cristacamps.com under "Parent Forms".

Sick Child Procedures: Children who are ill will not be permitted to remain at Day Camp. If your child experiences: fever, diarrhea, lice or nits, draining rashes, pink-eye, eye discharge, or vomiting, other arrangements will need to be made for their care. If a child becomes ill after drop-off, the parent/guardian will be contacted and asked to pick up his/her child.
